

About Bahram Beyzaie

Bahram Beyzaie, the author of Afra, or The Day Passes, is one of the most prominent figures in contemporary Iranian theatre and cinema. Often called the "Iranian Shakespeare," his works are a profound blend of myth, history, and the concerns of modern humanity. Women play a central and powerful role in his plays.

Since 2010, Beyzaie has been teaching and creating art at Stanford University in the United States, remaining one of the most influential voices of Iranian culture worldwide.

Afra: A Chance for Reflection

AFRA is more than a dramatic narrative; it is a full-length mirror held before us, reflecting ourselves, society, power, women, law, and morality. Afra is a simple, honorable teacher, standing in the limbo between truth and accusation, silence and outcry, existence and erasure — a woman made of light who stands tall against structures of power and humiliation, not to be a hero, but to remain human.

Like Beyzaie's other works, this play invites us to re-examine — to delve into the unseen layers of social order, to reflect on the place of the innocent before faceless systems, and to confront truths buried beneath the shadows of pretence. In Beyzaie's world, nothing is superficial: every word carries weight, every gesture is a sign, and every silence is a cry that will be heard. The staging of this monumental work is an opportunity to pause in the noise of everyday life and think about who we are — and who we could be. Afra is a return to theatre of ideas; theatre not as mere entertainment, but as awakening.

About the Director of Afra



Navid Pirouznia is an Iranian-Canadian theatre director, playwright, and theatre graduate with extensive experience in both Iran and Canada.

He has directed around 60 theatrical works, many of which have won prestigious awards. His notable productions include When the Cicadas Scream (winner of 11 provincial awards) and Afra, or The Day Passes (winner of 8 regional awards).

Alongside directing, he has taught acting and directing at institutions such as the Urmia Theatre Academy, the Young Theatre House, and the Urmia Cultural and Artistic Complex. He has also led playwriting workshops and directed more than ten staged play readings.

As an active figure in the cultural and artistic scene, he has served as a judge and selection committee member in festivals such as the FROM International Festival, the Khan o Man Festival, and the Azerbaijan Folkloric Theatre Festival.

Pirouznia has also been the representative for the Iranian Arts and Culture Association of Ottawa (PACSO) in artistic affairs.
